Report on Audit of the Financia Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of SHIVCHEM AGRO PRIVATE LIMITED ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at March 31, 2024, the Statement of Profit and Loss the Statement of Cash Flows forthe year then ended, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (herein after referred to as "financial statements").

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act, 2013 (the "Act") in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended, ("Ind AS") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at March 31, 2024, and the Profit and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

General Information:

Shivchem Agro Private Limited is a Company incorporated on 12.09.2021 under Companies Act, 2013.

Note 1: Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of accounting

The accounts have been prepared on the basis of historical cost convention. All income and expenses have been accounted for on mercantile basis. The accounts are in accordance with the applicable Accounting Standards issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India and the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 read with general circular 8/2014 dated 04.04.2014, issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs. All amounts are stated in Indian Rupees except as otherwise stated.

(b) Property, Plant and Equipment and Intangible assets

Property, plant and equipments are stated at cost of acquisition less accumulated depreciation. The cost of Property, plant and equipments includes freight, duties and taxes and other incidental expenses related to the acquisition. Borrowing costs directly attributable to acquisition of those Property, plant and equipments which necessarily take a substantial period of time to get ready for their intended use are capitalized.

(c) Depreciation

Depreciation has been provided on all Assets on Written Down Value Method except Lease Hold Improvement as per the rates derived from the expected life of the asstes as stated in the Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013, prorata Depreciation is calculated for all additions made during the year.

(d) Foreign currency transactions

Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the date of the transaction. Monetary items denominated in foreign currency and outstanding at the balance sheet date are translated at the exchange rate ruling on that date. Resultant exchange difference arising on payment or translation of liabilities and receivables are recognized as income or expense in the year in which they arise.

(e) Taxes on income

The current charge for Income Tax is ascertained on the basis of assessable profits computed in accordance with the provisions of the Income Tax act, 1961.

(f) Retirement and other employee benefits

The Gratuity liability payable under the payment of Gratuity Act, 1972, provides a lump sum payment to vested employees at retirement, death, incapacitation or termination of employment, of an amount based on the respective employee salary and tenure of employment. The Liability to pay arises once an employee completes five years of tenure of service in an organization. It is paid/payable to employee at the time of retirement or on resignation, or on death to his dependents. The Company has a policy of accruing Gratuity under defined benefits, based on independent actuarial valuations as at the balance sheet date.

The Company is not eligible to be covered under Payment of Gratuity Act, 1972, since there were less than 10 persons employed on any day in preceding 12 months.

Provident Fund: The company is covered under Recognized Provident Fund Scheme therefore, contribution towards provident fund for all employees is made to the regulatory authorities, where the Company has no further obligations. Such benefits are classified as Defined Contribution Schemes as the Company does not carry any further obligations, apart from the contributions made on a monthly basis.

The Company does not have any en-cashable leave encashment policy. There are no other en-cashable short term benefits. The other staff benefit schemes will be provided according to respective laws in respect of employees as and when these will be applicable on the Company.

(g) Earning per share

In determining basic earning per share, the Company considers the net profit after tax and includes the post-tax effect of any extra-ordinary items and for the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share such net profits are adjusted for expenses/income associated with the potential equity shares. The number of shares used in computing basic earning per share is weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period adjusted for any increase/decrease in the number of shares without corresponding change in resources.

(h) Impairment of assets

The carrying amounts of assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date if there is any indication of impairment based on internal / external factors. An impairment loss is recognized wherever the carrying amount of an asset exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the greater of the asset's net selling price and value in use.

(i) Provisions

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation, in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions are not discounted to their present value and are determined based on best estimate required to settle the obligation at the each balance sheet date. These are reviewed at each balance sheet date and are adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

(j) Contingent liabilities

Contingent liabilities, not provided for, are disclosed separately by way of Notes on Financial Statements.

(k) Cash & cash equivalents

Cash and Cash Equivalents includes cash in hand, demand deposits with banks with original maturities of three months or less.

(l) Cash flow statement

Cash flows are reported using indirect method, whereby profit before tax is adjusted of the effects of transactions of a non-cash nature, any deferrals or accruals of past or future operating cash receipts or payments and item of income or expenses associated with investing or financing cash flows. The cash flows from operating investing and financing activities of the company are segregated.
